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TO OUR PATIENTS:

The Division of Plastic Surgery at the University of Washington School of Medicine has one of the premier residence training programs in the country. For over 15 years, the clinic has been privileged to be an integral part of the program. Surgeons who have completed their general surgery training and half of their general surgery training and half of their plastic surgery training spend 5-6 months at this clinic for further experience.

The American Board of Plastic Surgery has certified graduates of the UW Plastic Surgery Residency Program. Many of them now hold academic positions at the University while others practice in the Puget Sound Area.

The ideal model for a training program includes the following: (1) Allow the resident to interview and examine the patient independently, (2) determine the problem(s), (3) formulate a solution, and (4) participate in the surgery.

Because this is a private practice, the degree of involvement of the plastic surgery resident is **TOTALLY** determined by you, the patient.
